


SafeAssign: Plagiarism Check

SafeAssign can check citations and run a plagiarism check on the work that students submit in Learn. The teacher needs to have set up SafeAssign before students submit their work.

Run a Check

See the manual “Submit Assignments in Learn” on <http://www.du.se/learningplatform> for information on how to create an assignment for submission.

We begin now by clicking on “Submission Details”. Lower down on the page, you will see “Plagiarism Tools”.



Submission Details

If any students are enrolled in more than one group receiving the same assignment, they will submit more than one attempt for this assignment. It may be necessary to provide these students with an overall grade for the assignment.

Plagiarism Tools

- Check submissions for plagiarism using SafeAssign
*SafeAssign only supports English-language submissions. See [Blackboard Help](#) for more details.
If SafeAssign is enabled with Anonymous Marking, SafeAssign Originality Reports will be hidden from Instructors until Anonymous Marking is disabled. However, Students may still be able to see SafeAssign Originality Reports depending on the state of the "Allow students to view SafeAssign originality report for their attempts" setting.*
- Allow students to view SafeAssign originality report for their attempts
- Exclude submissions from the Institutional and Global References Databases

To use this, you must tick the box “Check submissions for plagiarism using SafeAssign”. Note: it is not ticked by default. You will also see “SafeAssign only supports English-language submissions”. This indicates that SafeAssign has been developed for texts in English; however, it has shown to function with other languages as well – although there are no guarantees that it will.

There are two additional options: "Allow students to view SafeAssign originality report for their attempts" and "Exclude submissions from the Institutional and Global References Databases".

The first means that the student gets to see the same report as the teacher. The second means that the document that the students submit is not used to check against future submissions. For example, if the box is checked when Adam submits a document and five minutes later, Bertil submits a similar document, Bertil's document is not checked against Adam's.

Click on "Submit" when you are finished creating or editing the assignment; it will then be activated.

This paragraph means that the document has been reviewed and will be saved for use when checking against documents that are submitted in the future.

The following file formats work:

- .doc, .docx, .docm (Word)
- .ppt, .pptx, (PowerPoint)
- .odt, (OpenOffice, equivalent to Word)
- .txt, (pure text)
- .rtf, (almost like Word)


- .pdf (Adobe PDF document)
- .html (webpage)

If the student submits a document in another format, then it will not be checked.

The student can also choose to untick” I agree to submit my paper(s) to the Global Reference Database”. The submission will be sent to SafeAssign regardless. When the box is ticked, then others who use SafeAssign – for example, another university – can run a search on the document.

For example, if Charles checks off the box and submits a document, then the document is checked as it normally would be. However, when Charles submits the same document at another university that uses SafeAssign, then the document will be checked against the earlier submission that he made here.

Here, the student has both written in the text editor and prepared a Word document. As soon as the student clicks on "Submit", a check begins.





View Originality Report

Here the student submitted two texts, and both have resulted in a find in SafeAssign. Click on "View Originality Report" for more information. The report will open in a new tab/window.

To the right, you can see the course room (English Test Course), the name of the assignment (One assignment), the name of the student, the date and the time.

Under "Attachments", we can see the two documents. Now "a document.docx" is marked and any matches in SafeAssign would be visible. The sources show up both numbered and colour-coded.

- If you have ticked the box "Allow students to view SafeAssign originality report for their attempts", then the student can see the same report as you.
- All teachers can see the report regardless of who created the assignment.
- There is no % grade for plagiarism: if you suspect a student has plagiarised, then you need to report this to the University's Disciplinary Board.
