Yes, you will be able to speak, use webcam and upload documents in all of the meeting rooms. However, you need to have Adobe Flash Player installed on your system. Get it at <http://get.adobe.com/flashplayer>. To be able to share your screen with others, you will need to download and install the Adobe Connect Add-in.



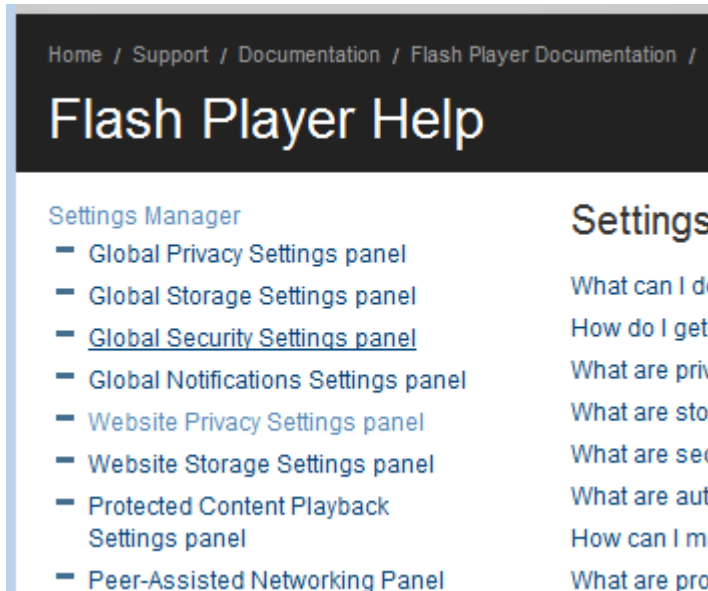
Where can I find the Adobe Connect add-in?



Please follow this short guide:

1. If you haven't already, please download and install Adobe Flash Player by using the above link.
2. Download the Adobe Connect Add-in at:
<https://connect3.du.se/common/addin/ConnectAddin.deb>
3. Start the installation by double clicking the file. Follow the instructions on the screen.
4. Go to "Flash Player Settings" by entering the address below:
http://www.macromedia.com/support/documentation/en/flashplayer/help/settings_manager.html

5. Click “Global Security Settings panel”



6. In the “Global Security Settings panel”, please check “Always allow”.
7. Close all your open web browsers and start a new browsing session. Go to the Adobe Connect meeting portal at <http://samtal.du.se> and the Add-in should be started when you have chosen which room you want to visit.
